What is PE and Sport Premium?

Government Policy: Sports Participation

"The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

We are spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016." (DFE 2015)

The school has continued to receive allocated funding directly to primary schools to support the provision of quality PE/sport. This year the school received £8000. It is important that we are accountable for this money and we get best value and maximum impact for our children.

Purpose of funding

"Schools must spend the additional funding on improving to improve the quality of the PE and Sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money" (DFE 2015)

Accountability

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.
