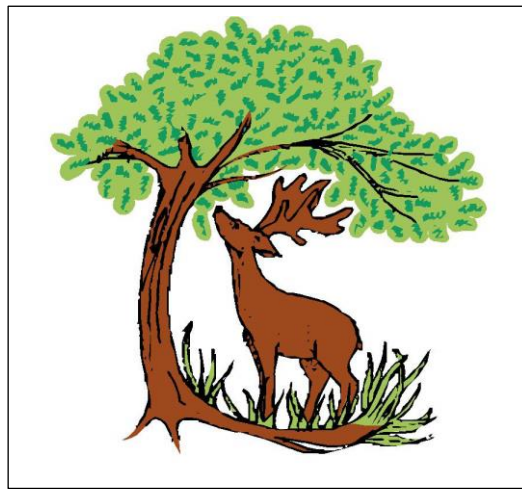

Willow Nursery – Where children learn to care, share and shine.

At Hethersett Woodside Willow Nursery you are assured of a warm welcome for your child and family. Our environment is warm, welcoming and nurturing and enables children to take their first steps away from home, whilst teaching them skills necessary for starting school. Our children feel secure, confident and happy and demonstrate an eagerness to learn.

Willow nursery is a maintained school nursery providing care and education for children aged 2-4 years. It is led by our Assistant Head Teacher who oversees all Early Years education across the school and holds a recognised Early Years specialist qualification - Early Years Professional Status (EYPS). She teaches within the nursery alongside a team of experienced nursery practitioners and assistants to deliver Outstanding Nursery provision.

Our provision is organised into two classes:



Hedgehog class (children aged 2-3 years) Squirrel class (children aged 3-4 years)

In our hedgehog room we offer up to 20 places with sessions currently running every morning Monday-Friday.

In our squirrel room we offer 26 places in each of our morning and afternoon classes (Monday – Friday), with lunchtime and all day provision for up to 15 children per day. This can be linked with our breakfast and afterschool club to provide families with flexible childcare, throughout term time.

We are a provider of Government funded early years education entitlement and offer both the universal 15 hours and extended 30 hours entitlement to all eligible 3 and 4 year olds. 2 year old funding can also be claimed for eligible families.

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage framework (EYFS), which continues in our school Reception classes.

Parents and the wider family are important to our work and we offer regular opportunities throughout the year to join us for play sessions and information evenings.

Our nursery teacher is also the Early Years SENDCO for the school and liaises closely with Speech and Language therapists, health visitors and other professionals to provide tailored support where needed. For further information, please see the SEN section of our website.

Key person Approach

Establishing relationships is key right from the start so we link each child and family to a key person. This is a member of our nursery team who will take a special interest in your child and family, building links and preparing a learning journal of your child's development and experiences through their time in nursery. This is shared with you regularly over a learning platform called 'Tapestry'.

As the children get older and move through our rooms, we group our key children into a 'family group' which the children name. Small group story, talk time and some activities take place in these family groups, to begin preparing the children for school.

Nursery Session – a typical day

Children respond to clear, well established routines and we teach these from the beginning. We have well-presented classrooms with clear expectations for learning. The nature of the day changes depending upon the age of the child and naturally progresses in structure as the class prepares for school.

A typical day.....

- ❖ Welcome time, sort our belongings, wash our hands, self-register with our name card.
- ❖ Play with our friends and adults.
- ❖ Hello session – rhyme, game, story, talking time, numbers, letters
- ❖ Snack time/Garden play
- ❖ Tidy up time, story/rhyme time
- ❖ Home time or lunch time

The children quickly recognise these routines, enabling independence and confidence.

Our day in action



Parent Partnership

Here at Hethersett Woodside we recognise that parents are their child's first educator. This is very important in fostering a joint approach to learning and something which we greatly value. Throughout the year we engage with you in providing learning opportunities and communications to support your child's education:

Tapestry learning journal

Maths game library

Library book exchange

Nursery rhyme and maths learning cafes.

Green Fingers gardening

On-line learning platforms to support remote learning.

Green Fingers Gardening

We place particular importance on learning in the outdoor environment and run a very popular gardening session called Green Fingers, to which parents and younger siblings are invited to join. A local 'Master Gardener' works with us to introduce families to growing vegetables and flowers within our nursery garden. The children experience planting, composting, caring for their environment, harvesting, cooking and eating their produce.



Nursery Curriculum

In both Hedgehogs and Squirrels, we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework (EYFS). This guides our planning and provision from the starting point of each child. We recognise that each child is unique, and joins us with different strengths, interests and needs. Through sensitive observation we plan for their next steps in development. This continues right through into our Reception classes.

As children move through the different stages of our Nursery and Early Years provision, we gradually layer their learning so that they are naturally prepared for future schooling.

In the Nursery we give particular focus to the core areas of:

Communication and language

Personal, social and emotional development

Physical development

Alongside this, through play and playful teaching, we introduce the children to mathematical learning, early literacy skills, develop in them a keen interest in the world and environment, and develop a wide range of creativity skills.

Each week we share our Nursery week with you, providing you with opportunities to support your children in learning and play at home.

Nursery session times

Sessions are offered to families for 38 weeks of the year.

Additional nursery hours will be charged at a rate of £4.90 per hour where applicable. All other times are wrap-around care and will be charged according to our Woodside Wonders charging policy. (Details on this are available from the school office.)

Admissions

We are a provider of Government funded provision for eligible 2,3 and 4 year olds, offering the universal 15 hours and extended 30 hour entitlement. There is a fee structure for pupils not entitled to the above.

Children can start Nursery from the age of 2 years. An admissions form can be downloaded from the 'key information' section of our website.

Your child will be placed on a waiting list and we will contact when we have a space available.

We hold an information evening in January for prospective families to view our provision and nursery offer.
