Premises Update

Throughout the summer, we have had a number of contractors in school working hard to improve some areas of the school. In KS2, we have converted the overcrowded cloakrooms into teaching spaces and have had lockers installed in the classrooms for the children to use. We have created a music room for all the peripatetic music lessons to take place in.



Downstairs, we've had a mural painted in the Pastoral room as well as one in a stairwell. Nursery and Reception outdoors spaces have been re-developed with a few items left to be installed. Our trim trail has now had a safety surface installed too.

Moving forwards, we are excited for work to begin on the south side of the school with more share, play spaces, bouldering wall on the hall, pond works and a play trail on the field.

Children's Advice and Duty Service

Karate Sessions

Earlier this half term, Years 3 -6 all took part in a taster session from Norwich Karate Academy. The children were all fantastic at taking part and trying to follow the moves the instructor was demonstrating. They were able to learn and perform moves in isolation but then also as a simple sequence. Our children showed great respect during the sessions and we are very proud of the way they represented themselves and their school.



School Council

It has been the time to launch and elect our new school council representatives. This is an opportunity for children in Years 1-6, who have not yet had this role, to represent their class and share their views on issues which



impact them. <u>Thursday 21st September was Campaign Day</u> and this was the day when children had the opportunity to speak and present their reasons to the class for why they believe they should be a school councillor. Last year, we were wowed with the campaigns that our children presented and we are already looking forward to seeing what this year brings.

On <u>Friday 22nd September, it was Election Day</u>. The school ballot box was brought to the classes and each child had the chance to vote for their representative; results will then be announced to the children this week.

Rock Steady

Rock Steady sessions have begun at Woodside. The children who signed up have been sorted into groups with drums, guitar, keyboards and vocals. We look forward to seeing them perform at the end of the term.

I often talk with children and families on a wide range of topics such as; anxiety, home issues, friendship concerns and much more. The Importance of Reading

Reading is fundamental to education. Learning to read involves many aspects, but the most essential element to develop is reading for pleasure. Parents, carers and families are indispensable in supporting children in becoming committed and enthusiastic readers.



Research in the United States has shown the impact of parents reading with their children. Here's how many words children would have heard by the time they were five years old, when:

Never read to	4,662 words
Read to 1-2 times per week	63,570 words
Read to 3-5 times per week	169,520 words
Read to daily	296,660 words
Five books a day	1,483,300 words

Children benefit hugely from listening to family members reading aloud to them. For children who are learning to read through the RWI systematic synthetic phonics scheme, they should continue to read these books independently, with an adult listening and supporting, as these books are sent home to align with their developing phonic knowledge. However, family members should read stories to children which are beyond their current level of reading, allowing them to develop their literacy skills to a greater extent.


Reading stories to your child:

- Make reading aloud feel like a treat! Make it a special quiet time and cuddle up so you can both see the book.
- Show curiosity about what you're going to read: 'This book looks interesting. It's about an angry child. I wonder how angry he gets...'
- Read through the story the first time without stopping too much let the story weave its own magic!

• Read with enjoyment. If you're not enjoying it, your child won't!

Read your favourite stories over and over again. On later readings:

- Let your child pause, think about and comment on what they've noticed.
- If you think your child did not understand something, try to explain: 'Oh! I think what's happening here is that...'
- Chat about the story: 'I wonder why she did that?'; 'Oh no, I hope she's not going to...'; 'I wouldn't have done that, would you?'
- Link the stories to your own family experiences: 'This reminds me of when...'
- Link the stories to others that your child knows:
 'Ah! Do you remember the dragon in...? Do you remember what happened to him?'
- Encourage your child to join in with bits they know.



Friends of Woodside



The Friends of Woodside will be holding an Annual General Meeting before half term. This will be communicated with you once a date has been arranged. The Friends of Woodside support the school by raising funds for things that the school budget does not cover.
